Opportunities for Storytellers

Storytellers are sought for the 2013 – 2014 season of *Word Plays: Storytelling at Proctors* (Schenectady, NY). The program of contemporary and traditional stories runs on Sunday afternoons at 2:00 pm from October – March. This program is aimed at boomers and younger audiences, one event per month, \$16 per ticket, \$12 with coupon.

Each program in this series will include a 50/50 mix of contemporary and traditional stories and feature six storytellers, for a total of up to 90 minutes of stories, not including the intermission. The contemporary stories are important; they are the easiest stories for new audiences to relate to.

Because theater audiences have come to expect it, it is important to have all the stories relate to a specific theme. The goal is to lure theater audience members to our shows.

Submitting Stories

Please send your submission by June 10 to kate@katedudding.com or aldenjoe@nycap.rr.com. You may submit stories to be included in one or more programs – even all of them. For each story submitted, please list:

The title of the program

The title of the story

The type of story: folktale (with region of origin), personal, historical, literary

The length of the story

Last year, some people submitted a story for one program, others submitted stories for all programs. In the end, to achieve balanced participation, each person told at a maximum of 3 programs, even if they submitted stories for all 5 programs.

Business Model

Proctors is charging us \$100 (regularly \$200) to rent The Gallery at Proctors (seats 100) plus \$140 for a house manager/sound tech plus \$1 per ticket. Proctors handles the box office, promotes Word Plays via their web site and brochures, as well as sets up the chairs and provides a mic and a stage. Last season, patrons donated a total of \$2,000 which paid for 98% of the costs at Proctors: \$235 for each Word Plays and \$823 for Tellabration. There will soon be a round of fundraising for Story Circle's upcoming season.

An example based on 40 tickets at \$12 or \$16 = \$500 (assuming most people use a coupon):

\$5 net to Proctors (\$100 + \$140 - \$235 from patrons' donations)

\$346.50 to be split among the tellers (70% of net profits (\$495))

\$49.50 to Kate and Joe (10 %) or 5% to Kate (for publicity activities) and 5% to emcee

\$92.80 to Story Circle at Proctors (20% for postcards, flyers, advertising)
