Story Circle of the Capital District was founded in 1983 to provide storytellers with a monthly forum for works in progress and to bring the art of storytelling to the public eye and ear. Currently there are 50 members who come from the Capital District, Washington County, and the Adirondacks. Members are available to tell their tales in parks, museums, nursing homes, libraries, classrooms, and coffeehouses and at community events -- wherever people gather to enjoy a spellbinding tale.

In 2007, **Story Circle** became one of the first resident storytelling companies at a performing arts center in the U.S. through a partnership with Proctors in Schenectady. StoryCircleAtProctors.org

Story Circle meets from 6:00-7:45 pm each third Wednesday of the month to share works in progress at:
